Your 5-night vacation begins with your arrival in Phillipsburg, St. Maarten the day before your departure. You will enjoy a one-night hotel stay in the capital city, with its sheltering Great Bay that has attracted international traders for centuries, still known as a duty-free shopper's paradise. With its sheltered harbors, trade winds and proximity to other islands, St. Maarten is also a yachting hub.

Embark on your cruise, sailing overnight and waking up for a day spent in Sopers Hole, a full-service marina in Tortola belonging to the British Virgin Islands. The marina is surrounded by beautiful green mountains and has tropical weather. The pristine blue sea waters make this a popular destination for those looking to discover these sites of the Caribbean. There is so much to do in Soper's Hole, enjoy a day shopping at many of the boutiques, have brunch at one of the sidewalk cafes or simply take a walk around the deck and catch an inspiring sunset.

Next you will push on for an evening arrival and next full day spent in Jost Van Dyke. A large, mountainous and very sparsely populated island northwest of Tortola, Jost Van Dyke, British Virgin Islands offers two good harbors and the lovely beaches of the Great Harbour and the White Bay. The island is a popular stop on the yachting circuit with the Soggy Dollar and Foxy's bars as favorite places to drop in. Foxy's Taboo Bar and Restaurant has a dock near Diamond Cay, which is a national park and bird sanctuary.

Sail overnight and wake up for a day spent in Virgin Gorda where the hallmarks of a British Virgin Islands vacation—scenery, relaxation and the sea—become even more pronounced. You won't find a lot of activities on Virgin Gorda, but if you enjoy superb snorkeling, scuba diving, and sailing, you'll be quite pleased. Although it's a small island, Virgin Gorda's landscape is diverse, with the south rather flat and the north mountainous. Four islands lie very close to its north: Drake's Island also called Mosquito Island, Prickly Pear Island, Necker Island and Eustatia Island. A group of islands called the Dogs lies to its west. The granite boulders in the south attract many visitors to Virgin Gorda. An area called The Baths is a must-see and one of the most photographed areas of the British Virgin Islands.

Sail overnight and wake up for day spent in Gustavia, St. Barthelemy's capital, main city and chief port. The city wraps around three sides of Gustavia Harbor, providing access to numerus walkable sites. At the impressive Mairie de St. Barth town hall on the far side of the harbor, stop to get a close look at the island's coat of arms. Also see Fort Gustav at the northeast entrance to the harbor. The ruins of stone ramparts remain, as does a sentry box, some cannons, a powder house and part of the old brick-floored bakery. The fort offers good views of the harbor and the town. Gustavia offers many more museums and historical landmarks. Gustavia is a great place to shop. Many of the stores and boutiques are found on Quai de la Republique, Rue de France or on other streets close to the harbor. Cafes and bars along the streets make for good resting spots during your stroll.

Your vacation concludes with overnight travel to disembark, the next morning, in in St. Maarten, where you began. This package includes a one-night hotel stay pre-sailing, includes transfers to and from port, and full food service on the Yacht.
